(iii)

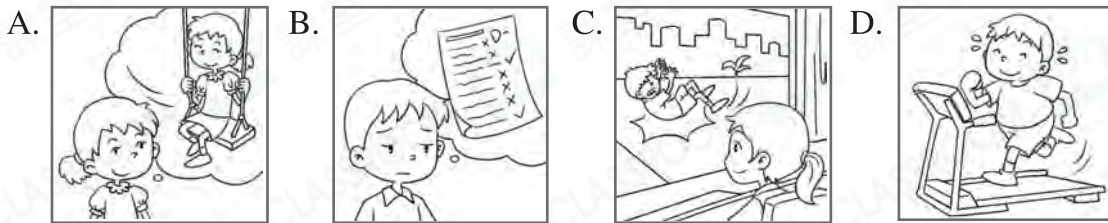
