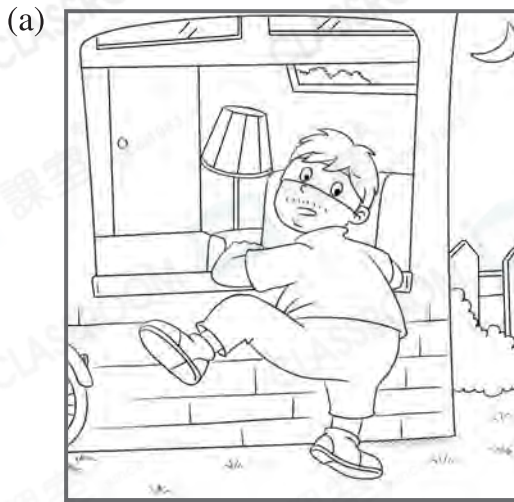
‘I truly want to thank all the people who helped us. I know I shouldn’t drive too fast on the road. I swear I won’t do so next time,’ said Mrs Moore.

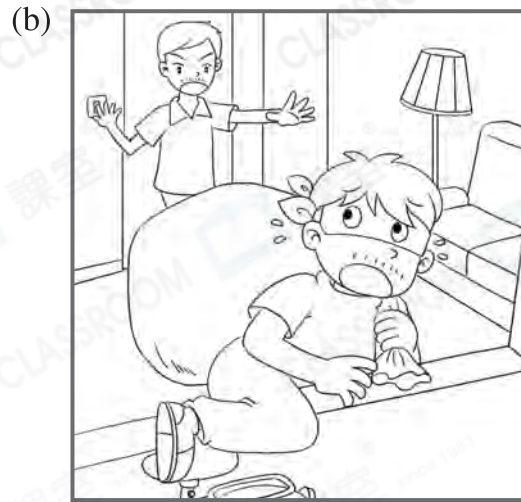

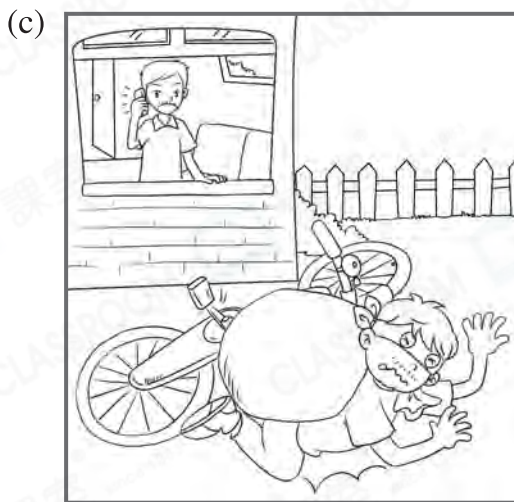

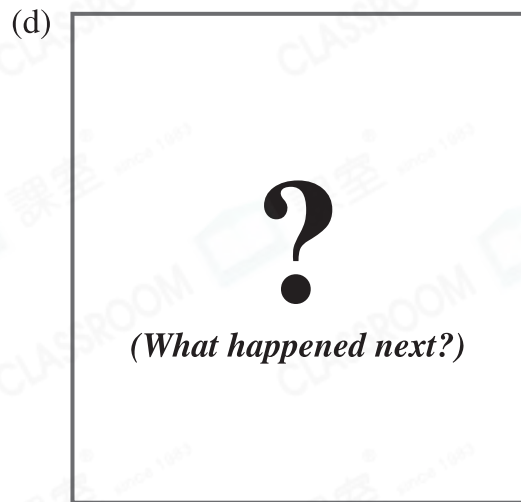
