

## Read the play.

Cat, Dog and Mouse are playing hide-and-seek in the park.

Dog: After I count to ten, I'll come and find you. One, two, three...nine and a half, ten! Ready or not? Here I come! (*turns around*) With my sharp nose, you can't hide from me!

[*Dog runs quickly to a big tree and looks up.*]

Dog: I can smell you, Mouse!

Mouse: Oh no, I just can't hide from your nose.

Dog: And Cat, I can smell you too. You're behind the bench.

Cat: OK, OK. You win. Now, it's Mouse's turn to seek.

Mouse: Great! One, two, three, four, five...

[*Cat and Dog hide in the same place. They are talking.*]

Cat: The park is so big. It may take Mouse an hour to find us.

Dog: Hoo-hoo, yes!

Mouse: (*shouting loudly*) I can hear you laughing, Cat and Dog! You're in the bush!

[*Cat and Dog come out.*]

Mouse: Don't you know I have a pair of sharp ears? Ha-ha.
