## What does the word refer to?

To find out what words like 'it', 'them' and 'there' mean, always read the lines before them.

**e.g.** What does 'they' refer to?

I go hiking with **Dad and Mum** today. ● — **Read the line before.**

I am tired. They are tired too. ● — **'They' are Dad and Mum.**

## Read the conversation and the posters.

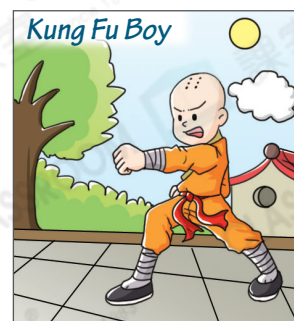
