## What does the word refer to?

To find out what a word refers to, always read the lines before it. Sometimes the question tells you which lines to look for the answer.

**e.g.** Read lines 2-3. What does 'it' refer to?

Karen made **a model of the house** which she lives in. She put furniture and dolls in **the model** to make **it** real.

Read the line before 'it'.

'It' refers to the model.
