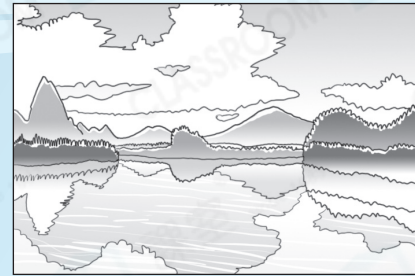

## Hong Kong Wetland Park

## General information

The Hong Kong Wetland Park is in Tin Shui Wai, Hong Kong. It has been opened to the public since May 2006. A wetland is an area of wet soil, where you can find different kinds of living things.



## How big is the park?

The Hong Kong Wetland Park has a 10,000 square metre large visitor centre, Wetland Interactive World. The rest of the park is 60 hectares of wetland.

## What can you see in the park?

There are many rare animals in the park. You can find crabs, fish and birds there. It is a good place to see mudskippers, which are fish with legs. The park is also the home of Pui Pui, a famous crocodile in Hong Kong. Pui Pui was found in Shan Pui River in June 2004 and was moved to the park in August 2006, so that it has a quieter and larger place to live. The park is also the house of the mangroves, which are trees that grow in the water.

## How do you go to the park?

Take the LRT and get off at the Wetland Park Stop.
