Grammar in Focus

We use 'ever' in questions to ask if someone has done something up to now, and 'never' to show that someone has not done something before.

Have you	ever	been to Japan (before)?	
Yes,	I have	been to Japan	before.
No,		never been to Japan	
			Yes, I have. No, I haven't.

We usually ask questions with 'How many times' in the present perfect tense. We use 'once', 'twice' and '(three) times' to talk about the number of times someone has done something.

How many times	have you been to	Disneyland?
I have	been to Disneyland	once / twice / three times.
