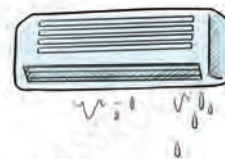

Notice on Water Dripping from Air Conditioners

Recently, there have been many complaints about water dripping from air conditioners. This is a serious problem. Water dripping makes the floor slippery and can cause accidents such as slipping and falling. It also messes the clothes of residents. We therefore ask all residents to take actions now to solve this problem:

- ① Use water drainpipes for all air conditioners
- ② Fix faulty air conditioners
- ③ Use non-drip type air conditioners
- ④ Check the water collection tray regularly



Any household causing this problem will get a warning letter. The household will have two weeks to fix the faulty air conditioner. If the household does not fix it by the deadline, we will contact the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department. Under the law, the household may have to pay money as punishment.
