



Fruit Kebabs

Ingredients (for 2 people):

- 1 apple
- 3 strawberries
- 2/3 cup of grapes without seeds
- 1/2 cup of canned pineapple
- 1/4 cup of dried coconut pieces
- 1 cup of non-fat yoghurt

Special Tools:

- 2 long bamboo sticks



Steps:

1. Wash the apple, strawberries and grapes.
2. Chop the fruit into chunks and put them on a large plate.
3. Design your own kebabs by poking the bamboo sticks through the chunks of fruit. Repeat this step until the sticks are almost filled with fruit.
4. Spread the dried coconut pieces on a large plate.
5. Pour the yoghurt onto another plate.
6. Roll the kebabs in the yoghurt and then the coconut pieces.

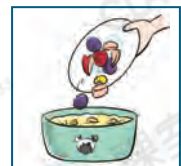

Making a Paper Star

What you need:

- a colourful paper strip
- a pair of scissors
- a glue stick

Steps:

1. Hold a paper strip and tie a knot at the end of it.
2. Pull the paper strip gently to make the knot tight.
3. Press the knot to make it flat.
4. Cut off the shorter end of the paper strip with your scissors.
5. Wrap the longer end of the paper strip around the five-side-shaped knot you have formed.
6. Keep wrapping until you get to the end of the paper strip.
7. Glue the end of the paper strip to the five-side-shaped knot.
8. Slowly use your fingernails to press the middle of each edge to form a 3-D star.

Great Cooking Tips

Cooking is fun, but to some people, it is difficult. Read the tips below from some of the top chefs in town!

1. Put salt on fish and meat in a way like 'snowing'. This can avoid adding too much salt on some parts but none on others.
2. Add a little sea salt and olive oil to season salad. In this way, the vegetables can stay crunchy.
3. Wash vegetables before cutting and peeling them as water takes away some of their vitamins.
4. Use high heat to roast a chicken in the oven. Put the chicken on a cutting board for at least 15 minutes after roasting to let the juice get into the meat.
5. Take out your steak from the fridge one hour before you grill it.
6. Stir the ingredients in sauce or soup often. Hold your stirrer just like a pencil to stir comfortably.
