How to Make Friends

Making friends with others is important because we need friends in our lives. They are the ones who stay with us through ups and downs. They always offer us care and support when we need them most. However, many people find it difficult to form friendships with others. **If you struggle with the same problem**, don't feel nervous. Here are some tips to help you make friends.

(i)

If you want to meet new people, it is suggested that you should join extra-curricular activities or interest classes. It is because you can make friends with people who actually have the same hobbies or interests as you do. Your hobbies and interests can also serve as the topics of your conversation with them. However, it is important that you don't speak too much in a conversation. You should leave time for others to share as well, or else they may think that you are arrogant and rude.

(ii)

When you meet others for the first time, you should be polite and friendly. However, that may not be enough for making friends. A study found that listening attentively when others are talking is the most important thing to do when you meet new people. This shows that you are paying attention to what they say and you are actually interested in knowing more about them. Therefore, they would be more eager to make friends with you.

(iii)

When you make new friends, you should act the way you usually do in front of your family and friends. It can be challenging for some people because they are shy and afraid of showing their true self in front of people who they are not familiar with yet. Give yourself time to gradually open up to new friends. Don't push yourself too hard as it would put you under a lot of pressure.

(iv)

To sum up, making friends with others could be more difficult than we expect. Joining different activities, being friendly and attentive, and showing your true self can all help you make friends easier. Remember that **friendship is a two-way street**. It doesn't work when only one person works hard to maintain the friendship. Therefore, don't be lazy and make an effort to show your friends that you value and care about them!

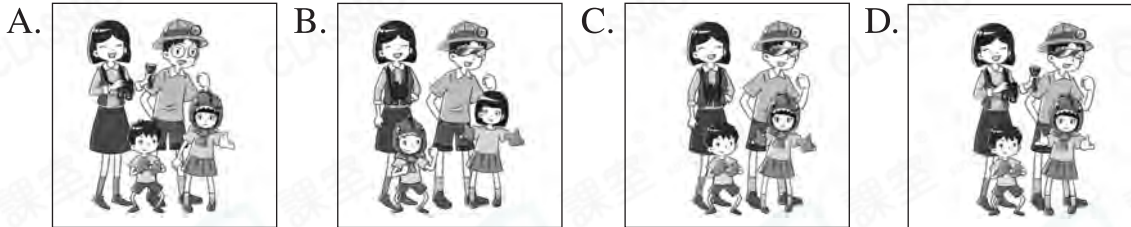

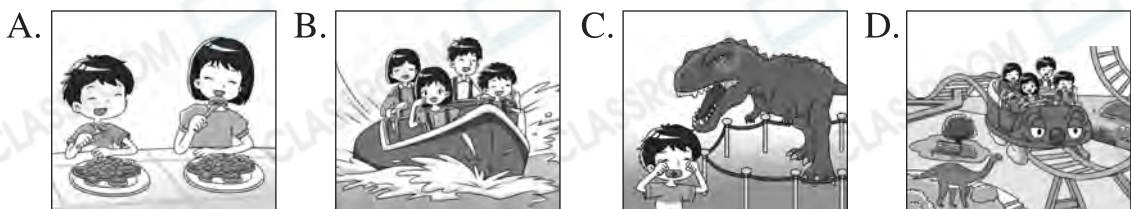
