How to Be a Good Child

Being a good kid is important. It often seems like an easy task. Many children want to behave well, but they don't know where to begin. If **you have the same experience**, don't stress. Here are some useful tips on how to be a good kid.

(i)

First, you need to maintain good hygiene. You should brush your teeth twice a day. You should always use soap to wash your hands when they get dirty and before every meal. When you get home from school, take a shower and change into some clean clothes. Don't forget to put your dirty clothes in the laundry basket.

(ii)

You need to have good manners. It is important that you express gratitude to others. For example, you should say 'thank you' when someone does something nice for you. If you just slightly nod your head without saying 'thank you', people may think that you don't appreciate their help. Besides, you must always obey your parents and teachers. However, that may not be enough to be a good child. Research shows that most well-behaved children respect their peers as well. Moreover, they behave better than other typical children. They tend to care more about their peers and are seldom rude to others.

(iii)

Besides behaving well, you should maintain the habit of tidying up after yourself. Keep reminding yourself '**a clean place is a safe place**'. This will encourage you. Remember to put things back where you found them—don't leave them on the floor or table. Bear in mind that you have the responsibility to take care of your own things. You shouldn't rely on your parents to do everything for you.

In summary, having good hygiene, manners and habits can help you become a good kid. Remember to keep them up. If you do that, you'll always be a good kid and your parents will be very proud of you!

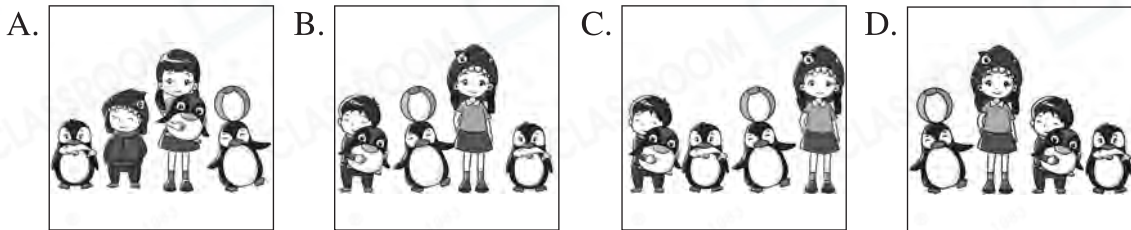
