People with round faces are usually caring. This possibly explains why most mothers have round faces. They usually have good relationships with their family and friends. Round-faced people are also reliable and hard-working. They like to arrange everything in an orderly way. Therefore, most employers like to hire them and they are often popular among their co-workers.

People who are adventurous and fearless usually have oval-shaped faces. They like to take on challenges. Most of the time, they can solve their own problems and achieve their goals because they are clever and seldom give up easily. They also like to make friends with others who have different interests.

Unlike oval-faced people, people with triangular faces prefer independence. Therefore, they don’t believe that friendships are important. They also have strong opinions so they seldom listen to others’ advice. They tend to do things in their own ways and make everything look perfect. Because of this tendency, they usually have creative minds, and often end up being successful artists. The complete opposite of them are square-faced people who like to make decisions based on facts and figures. They usually work as engineers, accountants or scientists.

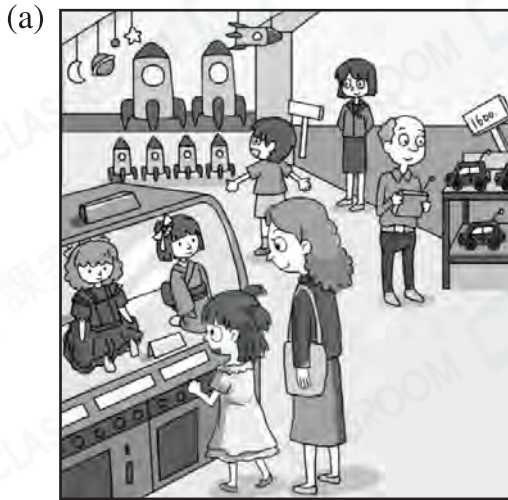

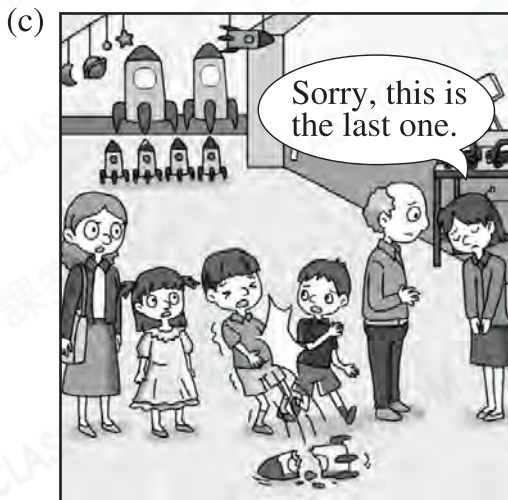

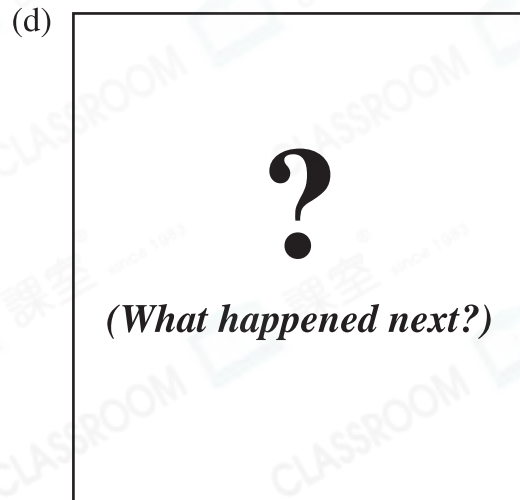
