The Art of Puppetry



Have you ever seen a puppet show before? The moving puppet dolls are actually controlled by the puppeteers!

James Jones is a well-known American puppeteer, who created the puppet characters of a famous children's TV show called *Happy Children*. 'I always see puppetry as a form of art. I like creating funny and interesting stories for children with puppets. It's a good way to teach children knowledge of the world. I always feel satisfied whenever I am told that children enjoy my works,' said James.

To be a puppeteer, you need to receive training at a puppetry school to learn the techniques of puppetry. **This** is something you must do if you want to be an exceptional puppeteer. In addition, most successful puppeteers are great voice actors. Therefore, you need to learn to speak in different voices to make your performance more entertaining when portraying different puppet characters. Besides, it is important that you know how to make your own puppets. It is certainly a **challenging task** to do. Apart from that, puppeteers have to be very creative. 'It's important to pay attention to the little things happening around you. They can be great inspirations for creating your own puppet performances. You may study the works of other puppeteers if you run out of ideas, but it is not a must,' James suggested.

Being a puppeteer is a tough job as it requires both voice acting and craft making skills. Those who are successful are usually hard-working and willing to continue to improve their skills. 'It takes time to become a professional puppeteer, but it's worth it when you see people enjoy what you've created. To me, that's the most amazing feeling in the world,' said James.
