

Our senses are amazing. Let's read more about them!

Eyes: see, read

Our eyes need light to see colours. Let's do this: Turn off all the lights in a room. Take out your colour pencils to draw a picture in the dark. Isn't it hard to pick the colours you want?



Nose: smell

When you smell something bad, what do you do? Do you cover your nose? Do you go away quickly? Next time, just wait for a while. The bad smell may 'disappear' just because your nose gets used to it!
