HONG KONG'S OUTLYING ISLANDS

Hong Kong is famous for its busy lifestyle and beautiful night view. At the same time, we can also find the different side of Hong Kong on different outlying islands.



Lantau Island is Hong Kong's largest island. The Big Buddha, the Po Lin Monastery, the Ngong Ping 360 Cable Car and Hong Kong Disneyland are the main attractions.

- 🚇 Tung Chung / Disneyland Resort MTR station (around 30 mins from Central)



Cheung Chau is the place where the annual Bun Festival is held. It is small but it is full of temples, seafood restaurants and beaches.

- 🚇 Central Pier 5 (45-60 mins)



Lamma Island is a popular hiking spot. It used to be a traditional fishing village. Now it has both Western and Chinese atmospheres. It has plenty of natural scenery and street stalls.

- 🚇 Central Pier 4 (30-40 mins)



Peng Chau is a quiet island with many closed factories and an empty theatre. Shrines and temples are the popular places to visit there.
