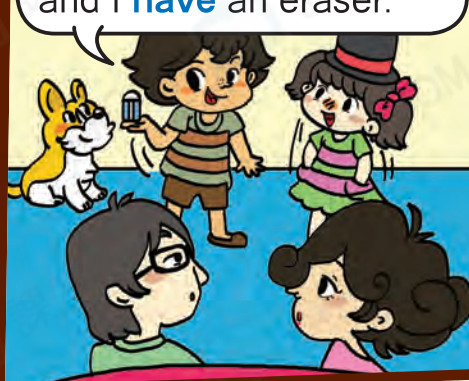

Grammar Explained



We use the verbs **'has'** and **'have'** to show that someone owns something.

We use **'has'** after 'he', 'she' and 'it'. We use **'have'** after 'I', 'you', 'we' and 'they'.

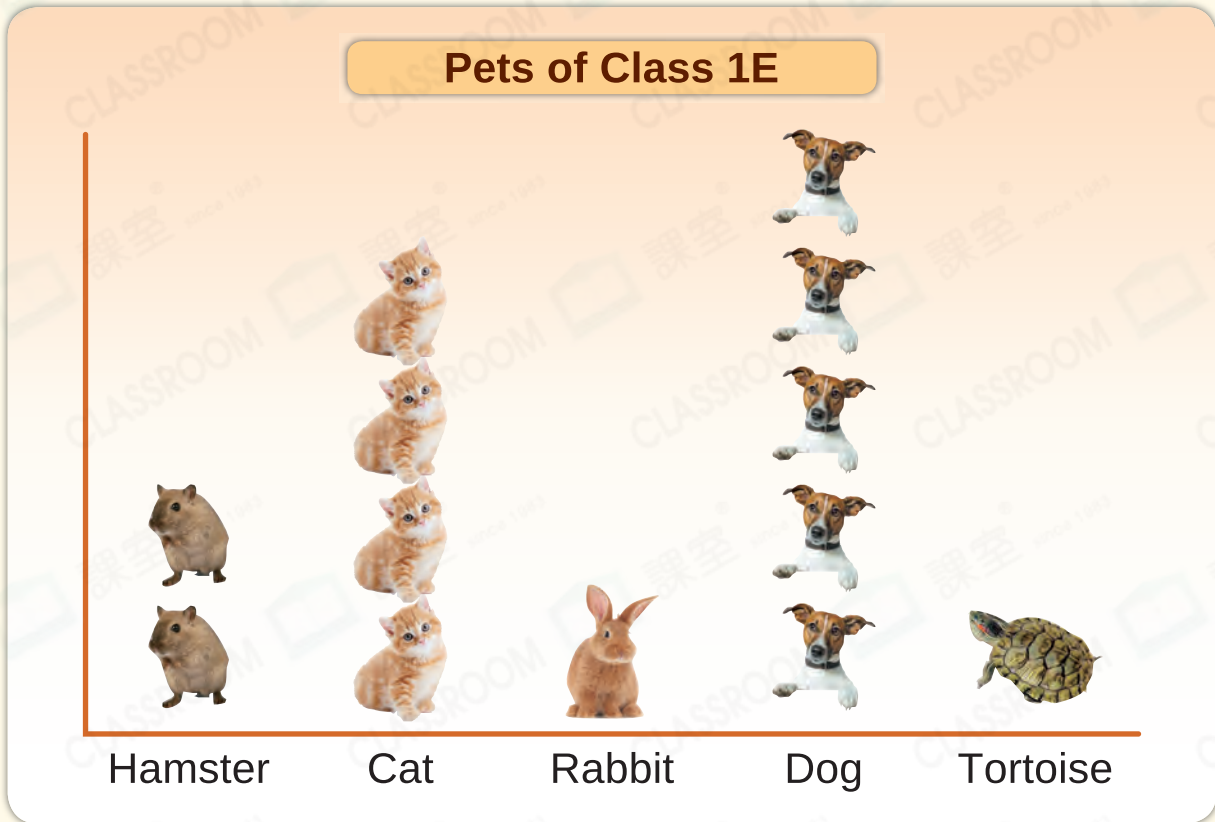
