Common Mistakes

(Prepositions of Time)

We use 'in' with parts of the day and seasons.

e.g. in the morning, in the afternoon, in the evening
in spring, in summer, in autumn, in winter

We use 'at' with specific time and festivals.

e.g. at noon, at three fifteen
at Christmas, at Dragon Boat Festival

We use 'on' with days of the week.

e.g. on Monday, on Saturdays
