I don't want to watch the Korean drama **or** the cookery programme.

I like the documentary.

Me **too**.

I don't like the documentary.

I don't like it **either**.



Grammar Explained



- a) We use the adverb **'too'** to show two positive ideas.
We use the adverb **'either'** to show two negative ideas.

😊😊 → **too** 😞😞 → **either**

😊 I like cheese.

😊 My sister likes cheese **too**.

😊 Sam likes swimming.

😊 He likes reading **too**.

😞 We don't like cycling.

😞 Mum doesn't like cycling **either**.

😞 They don't like sushi.

😞 They don't like sashimi **either**.

- b) We use **'both... and'** to join two positive ideas.
We use **'or'** to join two negative ideas.

both 😊 **and** 😊 😞 **or** 😞

Mrs Kim likes **both** Japanese food 😊 **and** Korean food. 😊

Kevin can't sing 😞 **or** dance. 😞

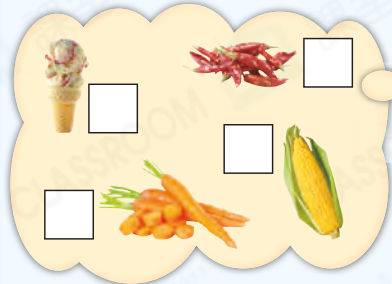

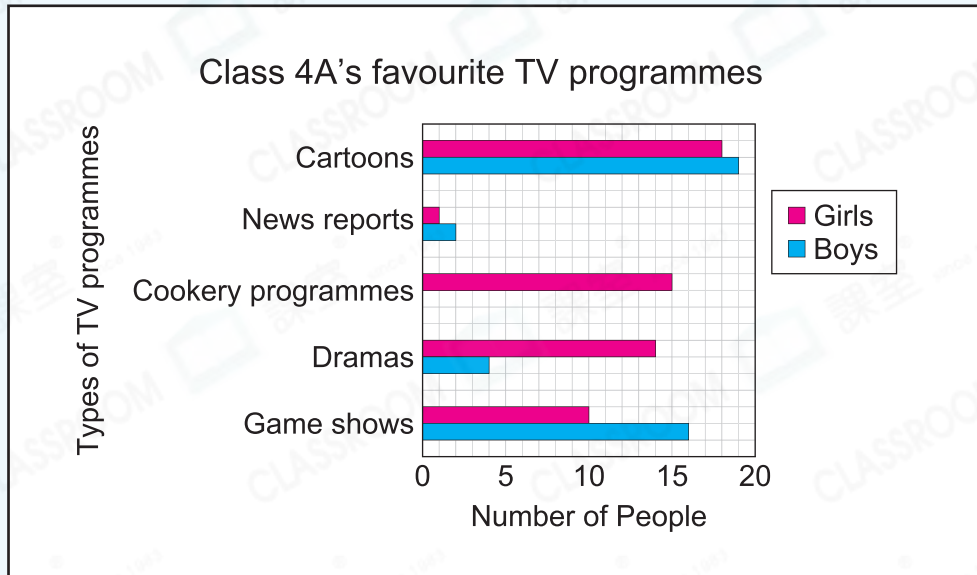
