b) We use **'either... or'** to show that there are two choices.

Either Cody **or** Janet can be the group leader.

You can **either** join a charity walk **or** sell flags.

c) We use **'neither... nor'** to link two negative ideas.

Neither Mum **nor** Dad knows how to ski.
fries pies are healthy food.

We can **neither** take photos **nor** run in the museum.
