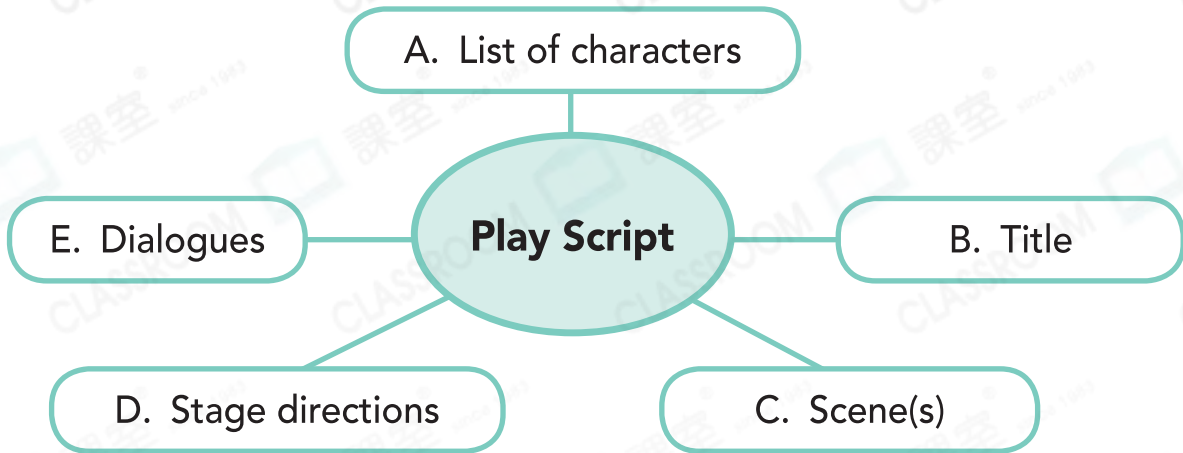

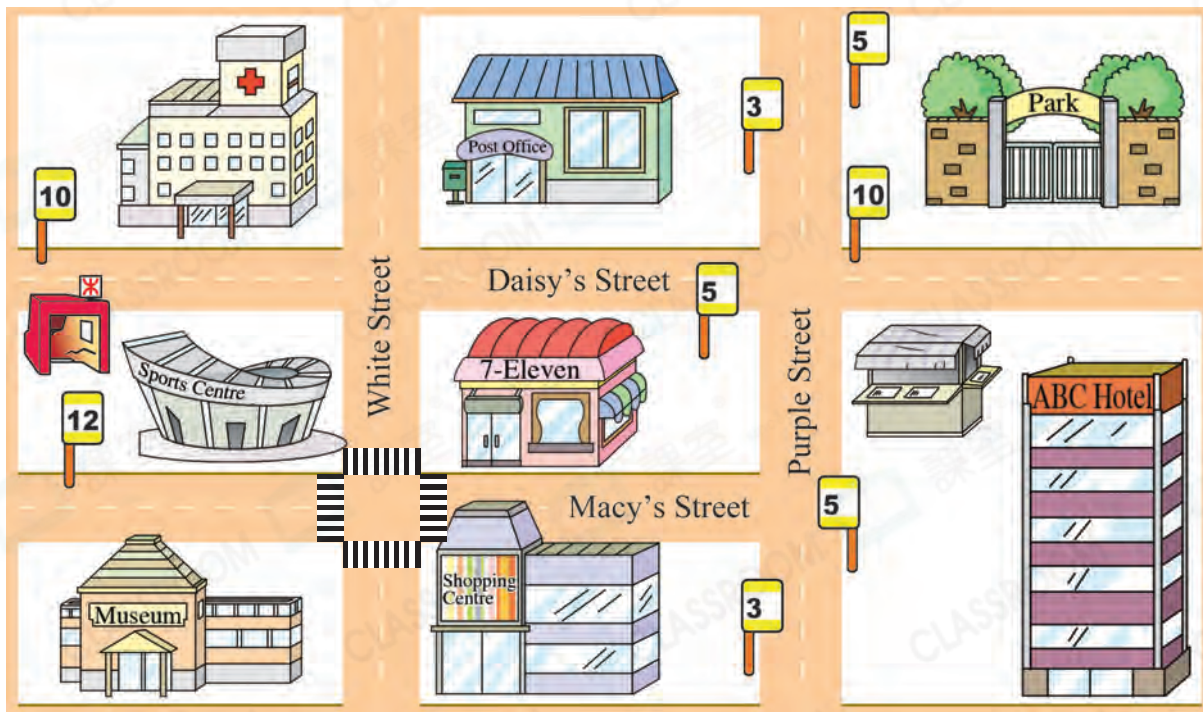

Mr Tam: Eight years ago in Kowloon District. Many people lived there, so there were more fire accidents. That's why I got the chance to save so many people.

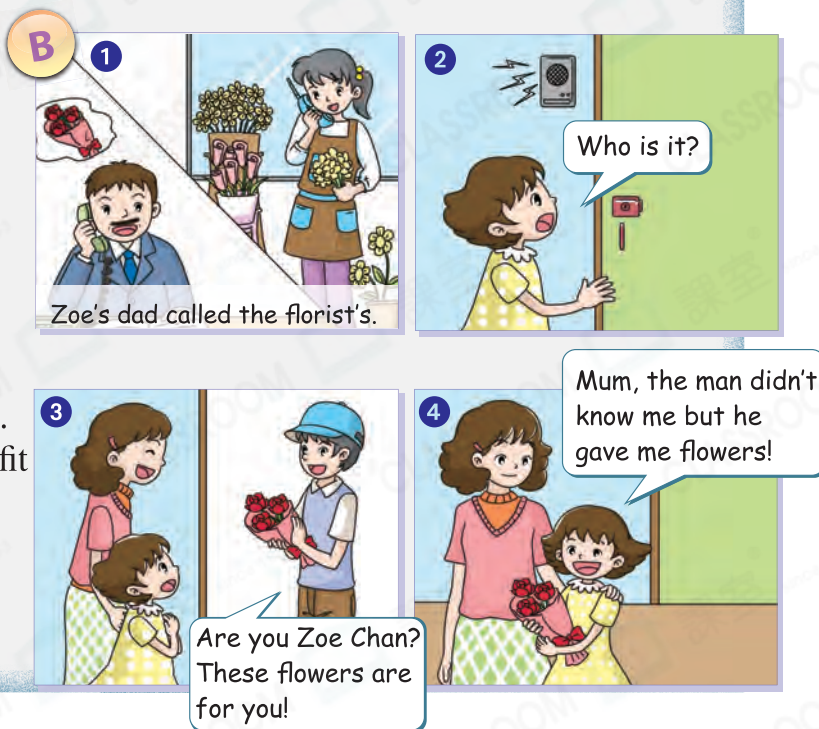
Janice : You often jump into burning buildings. Aren't you worried about your safety?
