



Reading Skill: Locating specific information

Learn together!

Some questions ask you to find a special kind of information in the text. There are two steps to answering such questions:

- 1** Read the question carefully and circle the keywords. Watch out for the question words, such as 'what', 'where' and 'who'.
- 2** Look for the related information in the text. For example, if the question word is 'Where', look for a place for the answer.

Learn more!

Let's learn what information these question words ask about:

e.g.

What?

ask about things

Where?

ask about places and locations

Who?

ask about people

How many?

ask about numbers

Give it a try!

e.g. Where does the tortoise like to sleep?

- A. on the grassland
- B. on a rock
- C. in the tree
- D. in a tank

In this question, the question word is **'Where'** and the keywords are **'the tortoise'** and **'sleep'**. You can know that the question is asking about **the place** where the tortoise likes to sleep. **Caption 1** tells you that the tortoise likes to sleep **on a rock**. So, the answer is option B.
