



Reading Skill: Eliminating wrong options

Learn together!

Some questions test your ability to read the options carefully and cross out the wrong options one by one. There are three steps to answering such questions:

- 1 Circle the keywords in the question and options.
- 2 Read the whole text in detail. Look for related keywords.
- 3 Compare the options with the text. Cross out the options with the wrong descriptions one by one. The remaining one is the correct answer.

Give it a try!

e.g. Which is **FALSE** about the story?

- A. It snows on the grassland in winter.
- B. Dennis' friends ask Dennis to work more than one time.
- C. Dennis cries because he wants more food from his friends.
- D. Dennis promises to work hard next year.

Option A is true because Dennis finds that **it is white outside** when the weather gets cold. You can picture that **there is snow everywhere**. Option B is true because **every time** when Dennis' friends ask Dennis to work, he says no and continues to play. The words 'every time' tell you that Dennis' friends ask him to work again and again. Option D is true because Dennis says he is going to **work hard** the coming year. Only option C is false. Dennis cries because he is **thankful** for what his friends do for him.
