## Learn Anytime, Anywhere

Do you only have lessons in the classroom and study with your textbooks? Many students also learn on the Internet and with mobile phones now!

E-learning means learning at home using computers, tablets, etc., usually on the Internet. Teachers can put teaching materials, such as videos and worksheets, in online forums. Students can study the materials at home and share what they learn with others in the forums.



The flipped classroom is a mode of e-learning. In most schools, students learn in the classroom and do homework at home after school. But in a flipped classroom, they have video lessons at home first. Then they do classwork and ask their teachers questions about the videos when they are back to school the next day.
