We use **'everybody'** to talk about every person in a group. We use **'nobody'** to talk about no one.

e.g. In the past, **everybody** used oil lamps. **Nobody** had lights at home.

e.g. **Everybody** wants to eat pizza.
Nobody wants to eat sushi.

In the simple present tense, verbs after **'everybody'** and **'nobody'** are singular.
