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Enter any hall before noon to join a lucky draw!

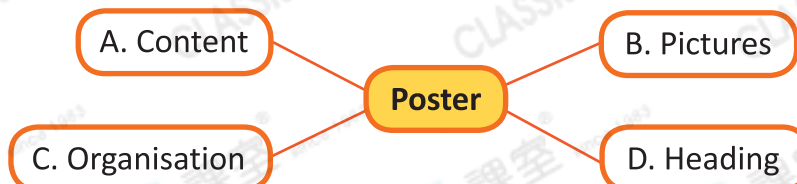
20th December, 20XX
