Reusing plastic bottles

① Pencil Case

Get two water bottles. Cut the bottom of each of them. Glue an old zipper onto the edges. It can hold your stationery.



② Snack Bowl

Simply cut the bottom of a plastic bottle. Use a hot iron to soften the sharp edge. Enjoy your snack time with this cool bowl!



Reusing lolly sticks

① Photo Frame

Stick some lolly sticks together and paint them with your favourite colours. Glue a photo to the back of the frame.



② Bracelet

Put a lolly stick into hot water to make it soft. Then put it around the inside of a cup to form its shape. Finally paint some pictures on it.
