### Saving Lives through Organ Donation

In early April, a dying mother Yip Ka-wai, 47, was in urgent need of a healthy liver. To her family's delight, she finally received two-thirds of a liver from a 29-year-old female donor. A week after the transplant, Yip's worrying condition showed very little improvement. She then underwent the second surgery and received a liver from a dead patient. Yip's elder daughter, Emma, was grateful that her mother's life was 'saved' by people they did not know time after time.

Emma said it was a pity that she could not be a donor because she was only 16 years old, but she was moved by and thankful for those **selfless** donors.

The rate of transplants in Hong Kong has been low for years due to the small numbers of donors. More than 2,000 patients are waiting for transplants to continue their lives. To ease the problem, the government is working hard to promote organ donation in the city.
