



In-text Grammar

We use the relative pronouns **'who'** and **'which'** to link up two sentences and give more information about the same person, animal or thing. We use **'who'** for people or animal characters and **'which'** for things or animals.

e.g. Vanessa is the princess **who** is in the yellow dress. (= Vanessa is the princess. The princess is in the yellow dress.)

e.g. The prince fights the dragon with the sword **which** is made of gold. (= The prince fights the dragon with the sword. The sword is made of gold.)
