

In-text Grammar

We use **'either... or'** to show that there are two choices. Only one option can be chosen. We use **'neither... nor'** to link up two negative ideas.

e.g. We can **either** run a second-hand stall **or** put on a drama at the funfair.

e.g. Keith loves **neither** track **nor** field events.

If the verbs are the same, omit the latter one and put **'either'** or **'neither'** after the verb.

If the verbs are different, put **'either'** or **'neither'** before the former verb.
