## Grammar Notes

### Adverbs: too / either



The queues are too long. I couldn't get a hot dog. I couldn't get a balloon dog **either**.

Don't be sad, Ellie. Here is a real dog for you. And a drawing of a dog **too**!

We use the adverbs **'too'** and **'either'** to express similar opinions. We use **'too'** to link two positive sentences. We use **'either'** to link two negative sentences. We put **'too'** and **'either'** at the end of the second sentence.

### Grammar Tip

The subjects of the two sentences can be the same or different.



→ **too**



→ **either**

Jasper walked on a water ball.

Dad rode on the Ferris wheel.

He played in the maze

Mum rode on the Ferris wheel **too**.

Ellie did not buy any snacks.

Grandpa did not go to the funfair.

She did not get the balloon

Grandma did not go to the funfair **either**.

## Grammar Notes

### Connectives: both ... and ... / or



We use the connective **'both ... and ...'** to link two similar ideas in positive sentences. We use the connective **'or'** to put two things together in negative sentences.

**both** 😊 **and** 😊

**(not)** 😞 **or** 😞

They played in **both** the maze **and** the jumping castle.

Ellie did **not** bring her water bottle **or** her camera.



### Common Errors

✓ She doesn't like clowns **or** magicians.

✗ She doesn't like clowns **and** magicians.

- I took photos with both the pirate **and / or** the fairy at the funfair.
- The magician didn't have a rabbit **and / or** a dove in his hat.



