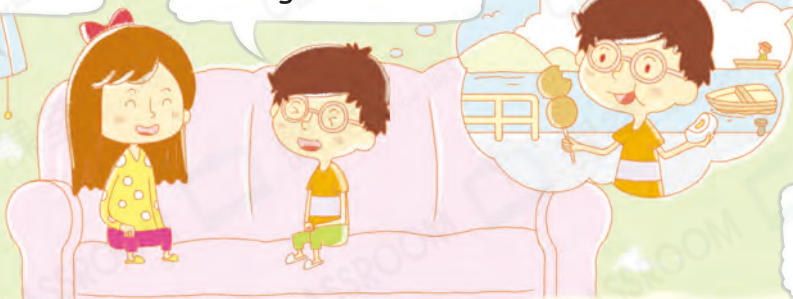

Simple Future Tense



We **will go** to Tai O tomorrow!

Great! I **will eat** many mango mochi and big fish balls.



Jasper, we are not going to Cheung Chau...

We use the **simple future tense** to talk about actions in the future. We use 'will' with the base form of verbs to form the **simple future tense**. We can also use the **simple future tense** with different question words to ask about things that will happen in the future.

What **will** they **do** in Hong Kong?

They	will visit	Ngong Ping Village	next week.
He	will not / won't go	to Ocean Park	tomorrow.
They / He	will be	free	next Sunday.

Grammar Tip

We often use time phrases like 'tomorrow' and 'next week' with the simple future tense. We do not put a preposition before them.

e.g. ~~x~~ on tomorrow
~~x~~ in next week

We use the following phrases to give directions.

Turn left.	Walk across the street.	It is on your left.
Turn right.	Walk along the street.	It is on your right.

- Could you show / showed me the way to the pier, please?
- Could you tell / told me how to get to the MTR station, please?
