1-Day Cultural and Shopping Experience in Hong Kong

10:15 am – 11:15 am Visit Che Kung Temple

Sha Tin Che Kung Temple is one of the most well-known temples in Hong Kong. Many local people visit it to ask for good luck, especially on the third day of Chinese New Year. There are two traditional Chinese cultural practices that you must try: draw a **fortune** stick to know your fortune for the near future, and spin the pinwheel to **dispel** bad luck.

A few exhibitions are held in the Heritage Museum to show the development of culture and **entertainment** in Hong Kong throughout the years.
