RASPBERRY TARTS

the perfect summer dessert



Ingredients

pastry:	200 g <u>(1)</u>	175 g sugar	200 g butter	<u>(2)</u> egg yolk
filling:	200 ml cream	85 g sugar	<u>(3)</u> lemon juice	<u>(4)</u> raspberries

Steps

1. Make the pastry by putting (5) except the yolk into a blender and pulsing them to the texture of breadcrumbs. Then, add the yolk to form (6) soft pastry.
2. Preheat (7) oven to 190°C. (8) each tart tin with the pastry and bake them for 30 minutes. Leave to cool, then trim the edges with (9). Next, carefully remove the tart cases from the tins.
3. To make the filling, whisk the cream with (10) sugar and lemon juice until thick. Evenly spread the mixture inside the tart cases. Next, place the raspberries on top. At the same time, heat up some jam with two tablespoons of water until bubbling. Paint the heated (11) over the raspberries.
